## Tampa Elks Win BIG at State Convention Wendy Hall, PER (2023-24)




Congratulations Tampa Elks Lodge #708 members!

Standing out in importance is the third award. We were named an All State Lodge, a high honor indeed.

In addition, Tampa Lodge has been named one of ten finalists for Lodges our size as an All American Lodge. This award will be given at the Grand Lodge Convention in Austin, Texas in July. Be Proud of Tampa Lodge!



## Captain Dale Mabry a Founding Member of **708**

Dale Mabry was born March 22, 1891 in Tallahassee Florida to Milton H. Mabry and Ella Dale Bramlett. He joined the US Army Air Service prior to WW1 and rose in the ranks to become captain. He survived the war and went on to become a dirigible pilot.

He was the captain aboard the Army Dirigible Roma February 21, 1922. The dirigible crashed in flight and exploded on that day with 34 lives lost which was the greatest amount of airborne casualties to that point in time.

Captain Mabry was buried in Arlington National Cemetery. It is not known exactly when he joined Elk Lodge #708, however, he was an important and founding member of our Lodge. He has several things here in Tampa that have been named for him including Dale Mabry Highway, Dale Mabry HCC Campus, Dale Mabry field in Tallahassee 1941-1945 as well as a restaurant in 1891. This restaurant was featured on national TV after renovations.


to get yours. There will be a limited number of tickets available at the door, so make sure you get yours early.

## OUR WWII VETS RETURN TO NORMANDY







Thank you for the honor of bringing FL Elks, guests, and especially our WWII Vets to Normandy for the historic 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of D Day.

Our flight out of Atlanta to Tampa last evening was delayed causing us to arrive around 10pm instead of 7:48pm as planned. Despite our tardiness, Tampa Police Department, Tampa Airport, Delta and TSA gave us a wonderful homecoming. Everyone was told to be seated upon arrival and not to leave their seats until our WWII Veterans and their Elk escorts departed the plane. At the gate, there was a Tampa PD and TSA Honor Guards saluting our Vets departing from the plane. They escorted us to baggage claim, collected our luggage for us. They waited while we got our cars, stopped airport traffic, and escorted us to our vehicles including loading luggage for us.

Our Veterans were interviewed by numerous national, French, and international media before, during, and arriving home back at Tampa. I will be sending the clips to Laz. A few photos attached with a 3 Star Army Surgeon General, Secretary of Army with lunch in Bayeux, French Navy Brass meeting our Vets before the parade, and a group photo before lining up for the parade. St. Mere Eglise is a small town of 2,500 people. On parade day there were estimated 120,000 from all over Europe

Fox 13 covered us every day and Mark Wilson is making a documentary that will be broadcast across the nation. Some clips below. FSEA Media Director Laz is also making a documentary of the trip.

Sadly, we lost one of our Veterans, Tampa 708 Malen Griep. Malen fought all over Europe including the Battle of the Bulge and liberating Dachau. Malen's two son's took him back to the States on Friday. He died on Saturday in Bay Pines VA. Malen's daughter Kathy stayed with us and gave his speech for him. An Elk's Memorial Service will be held at Tampa 708. The date has not yet been determined.

Dolly and I are extremely proud of everyone who accompanied our Veterans on this trip. You bonded together and collaborated effectively with one another making the trip delightful. Special thanks to Team Doctor's Dr. Sonia Perez Padilla, New Port Richey #2284, Dr. Kunal "Kuni" Amin, St. Pete #1224, and FSEA Historical Programs Team Members Mary Ducharme, Sebastion #2714, and PDD Fred Jaca, S. Miami/Coral

Gables #1676 for the planning and execution of the plan to make this trip successful! Last, much thanks to our Historic Programs Partners for ensuring the sacrifices of those who gave much for our freedom are celebrated and remembered! Rudy Masi, PSP





#### 159th GRAND LODGE SESSION STATE ASSOCIATION & LODGE PROPOSED RESOLUTIONS FOR THE 2024 CONVENTION TO BE HELD IN AUSTIN, TEXAS

#### You can read the entire text on the Elk National Convention Page at Elks.org

#### PROPOSAL TO AMEND SECTION 4.357 OF THE LAWS OF THE ORDER.

**PURPOSE:** To remove the word indoctrination, which has a negative connotation linked to forced acceptance of certain values of beliefs and amend it to the term orientation which is a familiarization with the organization's principles and beliefs.

#### PROPOSAL TO AMEND SECTION 9,170 OF THE LAWS OF THE ORDER.

**PURPOSE:** To move the control of the assets from the Grand Exalted Rulers appointed Defunct Lodge Trustees to that of the State Sponsor(s). 2) Lodges and State Associations are both 501(c)(8)s. This change will allow funds to be given to State Associations without placing a restriction on their use if so deemed by the State Sponsor(s).

#### PROPOSAL TO AMEND SECTION 14.020 OF THE LAWS OF THE ORDER.

PURPOSE: To allow Members the ability to download and print a current membership application directly from Elks.Org.

#### PROPOSAL TO AMEND SECTION 4.232 OF THE LAWS OF THE ORDER, WHICH STATES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 4.232. The Board of Grand Trustees shall acquire by contract with a qualified insurance company, and maintain in effect, a master comprehensive all risk of physical loss and crime coverage program for the properties and functions of the Grand Lodge, each Local Lodge, and separate corporations organized and existing under Section 16.030 of the Grand Lodge Statutes as they shall require from time to time and shall be available. Premiums for coverage shall be separately assessed against those entities in such amounts and at such times as will be required to provide the coverage requested and in place. Each of said entities sr.a!! bc are not required to participate in the program, The program shall be effective as to each line of insurance coverage for each entity on the annual date its present policy (policies), in effect on the adoption of this Section, expires. Entities choosing not to participate with the Grand Lodge approved qualified insurance company are to provide proof of their all risk of physical loss and crime coverage of their Local Lodge and any separate corporation. The coverage is to be provided by a qualified insurance company, and proof of coverage will be provided to The Grand Lodge if requested by The Grand Lodge.

Each Local Lodge, and separate corporations organized and testing under Section 16.030 of the Grand Lodge Statutes not participating in the contract obtained by the Board of Grand Trustees shall acquire and maintain, with a licensed insurance company in the State where the Local Lodge or separate corporation exists, a policy to cover risk of physical loss and crime coverage. Risks Of physical loss shall include coverage of a minimum of fifty percent of the replacement cost of the property, and replacement cost values must be updated a minimum of once every five years.

#### PROPOSAL TO AMEND SECTION 12.050 OF THE LAWS OF THE ORDER, WHICH STATES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 12.050. The Secretary of the Lodge shall: /#j Give bond of at least \$5,000 or in a greater amount as may be provided in the By-Laws, unless such coverage is provided through the Grand Lodge insurance program. The proposed amendment would read as follows: Section 12.050. 


